DIRECTORS MEETING 5 APRIL SUMMARY

Present MR, BF, RM, DB, MRh, PK, AS and Company Secretary JM

Two wheelbarrows and a generator have now been delivered.

A letter to be written to the City Council to inform them that we have met our charitable obligations for 2017.

The insurance cost for the club was agreed. This does not include buildings. Buildings are covered by a council fund but have been advised to investigate our own insurance as the council scheme is very slow to pay out.

The treasurer reported that the accounts were healthy and in good order.

Money in dispute in connection with a former member has been fully provided for in the 2016-17 accounts. The money remains outstanding and efforts to recover will continue. Rail chairs which are now surplus to requirements have also been written off in the accounts. The chairs will be put up for sale.

The 5" gauge trolleys retrieved from a former member will not be finished off by the club, but if any member wishes to pursue the project they should ask a Director for details.

It was noted that the total signalling system was approved in the minutes dated 29th Oct 2014 and so it was agreed that a sum not exceeding £2000 be set aside to complete the installation and to be spent over a 2 year period from now.

Evergreen Railway is to be invited to run at Eaton Park on the 10th September.

A club secretary is required to conduct all social correspondence. This post is in addition to and different to the Company Secretary who is at present listed on the web site and receiving all correspondence. MR will now be the contact and pass on the correspondence to which ever person it concerns

Design of new membership card was approved and the mem sec will get costings. Members will receive their cards in a few weeks time.



Cover Story

Robert Bailey's project - Beeleigh Mill, Essex.

I am making a 1/16th model of the Beeleigh Mill Woolf compound jet condensing beam engine, built circa 1835. Beeleigh mill (right) was large flour mill on the river Chelmer near Maldon, Essex. It had two water wheels driving 10 stones, to which was added a separate building which housed a steam-powered beam engine driving five millstones. The main building housing the waterpowered wheels burnt down in a fire in 1875.





The site, which is Grade II* listed, now comprises the building housing the steam engine (left) and the drive gearing for its millstones, the brick housing for one of the waterwheels, and the two adjacent brick-lined barge docks used for loading flour for shipment to London.

The steam mill is divided into 2 rooms, separated by a brick partition. The smaller north-western part is full height and contains the complete iron, double-acting Wentworth

compound steam beam engine which was installed in 1845. Alongside is an 'Elephant' boiler with 2 safety valves and firebox. It is the only surviving example of this type of boiler in England, though it was more popular in France and Belgium.

The ground floor of the larger room contains the drive gears including a circular-plan iron hust with an iron upright shaft with great spur wheel, which drive each of the five pairs of stones.

The upper floor has the emplacements for the stones. The drive shafts are in place, but the stones themselves are no longer there.

Although not currently visible, a hide-out was built during WW2 under the floor of the steam mill for an auxiliary unit to hide should the enemy invade. Access was from a trapdoor in the building, with an escape route which came out in the tail-race tunnel from the nearer mill-race. After the war, this hide-out was filled in by the army.

The engine complex burnt down in 1875 and has been derelict since then. There is a group

I have been visiting it for the past 2 years and have almost finished this model (right). I have had to guess what is happening inside this engine as it has remained neglected since 1875 and is very rusty. I have had the model engine in steam and have made a video of it. I have also made a perspex model of the condenser/air pump to see what the work entails and also to show



what is concealed inside the castings. The model air pump incorporates lift valves that use chamois leather as the valve rather than rhinoceros hide or latex rubber as in the original. The engine was made by Wentworth and Sons in Wandsworth, and there is a sister engine in the former *Young's* Ram brewery in London, which closed in 2006.


Pete Franklin has surplus materials for disposal
