DIRECTORS MEETING 08 NOVEMBER – SUMMARY

The meeting opened with an announcement of the death of member Raymond Snelling.

The directors resolved to invite Neville Gower to succeed the late Arnold Hoskins as president.

It was agreed that the society would affiliate to the *Northern Association* and that the secretary would make the application. [this has since been done, ed.]

The purchase of new batteries for the Cl.42 was authorised.

The treasurer advised on moves to unfreeze the society bank account and to change the mandate.

The society currently has eight directors. Up to twelve are permitted. It was resolved to co-opt Mike Riches from Jan 1st 2017. The secretary would handle the necessary procedures.

The distribution of bulletins was discussed. It was resolved that Philip Moore would ensure that members without access to the internet would be provided with hard copies, either by post or distribution at monthly meetings.

The new society rules would be posted to all members at renewal. [These are currently available in the members area, ed.]

Electrical and water provision to steaming bays were authorised to be modified for easier access.

It was suggested that the society be involved in fundraising to repair a broken park feature that was in danger of dereliction. This will be followed up as details become available. It was suggested that Mayday bank holiday could be devoted to this.

The treasurer presented a financial report with recommendations for further actions.

The Chairman stated the position that the previous closures to the public on last Sundays of the month will be discontinued. Members are invited to run their light engines, without the requirement to carry a guard, at all times on a Sunday, subject only to train protection procedure in the event of a breakdown. It was also resolved that private running on the ground level track will also be encouraged on the first Sunday of the month when the raised track is in use. This will facilitate those members who wish to run their engines without a public presence.

Philip Moore will acquire a strip light and associated fittings for the signal box.

A director was questioned regarding a potential conflict of interest with a rival society and stated that none existed.



Raymond Snelling

1933 - 2016





The death is announced of member and director Raymond Snelling, following a recent illness. Raymond's involvement with the NDSME dates back to the early 1960s. He had been a director for 44 years and had memories of the original premises in King St. that were destroyed during the war. Barry Steel, a contemporary of Ray writes,

"Raymond was a very skilful and enthusiastic member of the Tuesday gang helping to build the new Clubhouse, as well as many other projects. He was also a master craftsman in boat building which was his profession. Raymond could turn his hand to most things and was always ready to help out when asked. A challenge for him came when I asked him if he could design and build a dining room table for us. This he did willingly, from choosing the wood in the yard to the finished product. What a masterpiece! Beautifully polished with extension panels underneath to extend to 14ft. I know he will be missed by members of the Club. He was an enthusiastic and loyal member."

Neville Gower writes fondly of Raymond,

"There is a picture of Raymond on a very wet day (in 2003, above) helping to secure the roof trusses for the building at Eaton Park, I was on the other end out of sight. I met Raymond when I first joined NDSME and we soon became good friends. My interest in building loco's and Raymond being the Boiler inspector meant that he soon took a great interest in what I was doing with lots of advice and practical help. Then came the construction of the Building in the Park. Ann and I were visiting Joyce and Raymond at their home, when Joyce took me to one side and asked if I would ask Raymond to help me to put up the building. I did and rest is history. We worked together with others and the Building grew. Raymond liked to work in a small group, and had many skills. I remember arriving at the Park with a covering of snow on the ground. I had unlocked the platelayers hut when Raymond arrived. We were the only ones there that day. Raymond looked at me and said "We must be bloody sorft coming here on a day like this". We brushed the snow off the scaffolding boards and laid bricks all day finishing off the top of the wall on the south side of the building and went home feeling very satisfied with our days work. After the building came the laying of the 7/14" ground level track and all the accessories that has made the railway what it is today (including the tunnel that Raymond was recently involved with). Raymond with others has worked endlessly with no reward, but with pride and satisfaction. Raymond has been a great asset to NDSME for his skills and advice and I for one will miss very much, as I know other members will. He is at peace now with Joyce who I know he sadly missed so much."

NDSME Chairman Barry Fane and the Directors would like to express their heartfelt sympathy to Rays family at the loss of such a respected and valued member of the society. Rays funeral will be at St Faiths at 1100 on the 28th November. Family flowers only, otherwise donations to the Big 'C' Fund


Members visit Gauge One show at Hepworth


Mike Fordham reports,
