A new loco emerges...

Cover pic - A new loco is born

Member Mike Riches is a prolific loco builder, having constructed at least five locos in the last ten years. Informally known as *dieselmike*, there is the clue as to what he has built: two Hunslet 4W petrol-electric diesel shunters, a Class 37 petrol-hydraulic, a diesel hydraulic autotruck and now his latest creation, a Lister autotruck with exposed engine. This one, in



a long line of petrol and diesel powered units, has a one and a half HP single cylinder diesel engine belt driven to a Reliant Robin four speed gearbox and then chain driven to the axles. The clever design puts the engine weight over the front axles and the driver's weight over

the rear for maximum traction. It has a very natural driving position as the clutch is operated by the left foot, the gear lever is operated with the left hand and the right hand is used for both throttle and brake. It has rubber bush suspension.

Auden, Britten <u>and</u> trains! A gem of UK cinematographic history. *The Night Mail* (1936)

Night Mail is a 1936 English documentary film directed and produced by Harry Watt and Basil Wright, and produced by the General Post Office (GPO) film unit. The 24-minute film documents the nightly postal train operated by the London, Midland and Scottish Railway (LMS) from London to Glasgow and the staff who operate it. Narrated by John Grierson and Stuart Legg, the film ends with a "verse commentary" written by W. H. Auden to score by composer Benjamin Britten. The locomotive featured in the film is Royal Scot Class No. 6115 Scots Guardsman.

Night Mail premiered on 4 February 1936 at the Cambridge Arts Theatre in Cambridge, England in a launch programme for the venue. Its general release gained critical praise and became a classic of its own kind, much imitated by adverts and modern film shorts. *Night Mail* is widely considered a masterpiece of the British Documentary Film Movement. A sequel was released in 1987 entitled Night Mail 2.

Sadly, no mail is conveyed by train any more.


COMEDY CORNER



Having recently joined NDSME I was asked to introduce myself.

I have always had an interest in railways and am essentially a frustrated Model Engineer.

After serving a Technician Apprenticeship (to HNC standard) with the Marconi Company in the 1960 s I invested in a Myford S7 lathe intending to go into Model Engineering .



However this lathe became the basis of a Sub- Contract Engineering business which became a full time enterprise after leaving Marconi in the early 1970 s. Unfortunately running a business left little time for pursuing hobbies – so Model Engineering "remained on the back burner.

From then on I attended "The University of Life" until 1994 when I was able to sell the business and retire very early. Interestingly the original Myford lathe retired with me! At this point my wife and I moved to Pulham Market in Norfolk intending to live life in the slow lane.

Perhaps this would be the long awaited opportunity to do some Model Engineering?

No – rather perversely after a couple of years I started another Hobby Business - Peartree Engineering - providing a Machining and Manufacturing Service to some of my old contacts. The need for a flatbed works wagon was discussed and this will be initiated. Allan Shirley willing to sell two x bogie components


The requirement for passenger stock on the ground level to be fitted with continuous brakes was noted.


